I strongly believe that learning should be fun and that children should have fond memories of their time at primary school. In my role as the English Link Governor I hope to help support Moorlands in ensuring continuous improvements in results.

Jacquie Wilson

I was asked in February this year if I would consider becoming a governor and, after meeting the Head for a talk, I attended my first Governors' meeting on March 6th 2018.

I studied Design in the Borders of Scotland, graduating in 1974. I spent 10 years in industry in a variety of roles before being appointed to a lectureship at the University of Manchester. For the last 17 years of my time at Manchester Uni I was also a hall warden, living in two very different halls with my two children. Living in halls, one a modern self-catered hall and one a traditional catered hall where academic gowns were worn to dinner, was a great experience. I learnt so much about different cultures and countries as well as dealing with all sorts of issues and problems including medical emergencies.

6. CHAIR'S STATEMENT

Over the academic year 2017-2018, all governors have worked extremely hard as part of the Board to support the Headteacher and the staff at Moorlands to provide a happy, caring school which meets the needs of each and every pupil.

As governors, our formal role is threefold: to provide a strategic direction for the school; to hold the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school; and to oversee the financial performance of the school, including agreeing the annual budget. We do not get involved in the day to day running of the school.

Dr Nick Wheeler's term finished in November 2017 but we were delighted to fill the Parent Governor vacancy with Mrs Helen Boyle who joined us in December 2017. Mr Kane Simons resigned as Co-opted Governor in January 2018 due to a career change and we were joined by Dr Jacque Wilson in March 2018. Sadly Mrs Julie Jenkinson resigned in March 2018. Finally after many years as Governor, Chair and Vice Chair Louise Smith resigned at the last meeting of the academic year.

During the academic year 2017-2019, we met as a whole governing body five times, four as full Governing Board and once as an extraordinary meeting. We also had four meetings of our Resources sub-committee and two meetings of our Pay, Personnel and Standards sub-committee to discuss and question policies and developments in more detail. Each governor served on one of the committees, according to his or her interests, skills and experience. Governors also attended a training session held at Moorlands by Julie Lawson, Governor Services Manager on Safeguarding for Governors.

Moorlands had a short inspection by OFSTED on the 27th of March 2018 which was attended by most of our Governors. We were very pleased to again be judged as Good with the inspector recognising our continued improvement in many areas.

In accordance with government requirements, all governors are now DBS checked.

Some examples of work we have undertaken this year include:

- Each new governor undertaking online Level 1 Safeguarding training in accordance with new governance rules. All governors repeat this every 3 years as a minimum

- Governors attended a variety of training courses run by Trafford's Governor Services, including; Roles & Responsibilities for Governors, Holding School Leaders to Account, HR Briefing and Employment Law: update for governors, Succession planning of the board and governor recruitment, Safeguarding and Governors' Forum events
- Working with the Headteacher and Business Manager on the school's business plan and annual budget
- Working with the Headteacher on the school's Raising Attainment Plan
- Considering and approving policies, including for example Maths and Calculations Policy, Behaviour Policy and Volunteer Helpers in School Policy
- Contributing to and approving the School Financial Value Standard
- Continuing our 'meet the teacher' feature, where we have invited a member of staff to our main meetings, to learn more about their particular individual experience and vision, for example during this year Miss Calladine attended one of our board meetings to introduce herself to Governors and gave a brief explanation of her experience and career. She has worked at the School since September and is a Year 6 teacher and the Music Co-ordinator
- Continuing our 'Link Governor' work: this year the Maths Link Governor (Liz Hocking), English Link Governor (Louise Smith) and SEN Link Governor (Sue Harrison) visited the school in this capacity and wrote reports for the Board
- Scrutinising and approving the Pupil Premium Report and Sports Premium Report
- Discussing outcomes from Parents' Questionnaire
- Performing the Trusted Observer role during administration of the SATS (Sue Harrison)
- Working with the school's external adviser to undertake Headteacher performance management (Jo Renfrew and Louise Smith)
- Attending and supporting the school during the open mornings for Templemoor Infant and Nursery School children and parents
- Responding to parent queries
- Attending and being interviewed by the inspector at the OFSTED short inspection on 27th March 2018
- Working with external bodies that resulted in the installation of the hugely successful Rain Gardens

It has overall been an eventful and very successful year.
