Secondary School Selection

Please be aware that we have been sent the flowing information regarding the application process for this academic year:

The closing date for on time applications is 31st October 2020.

This year, the DfE issued special guidance for grammar schools which strongly advised that tests should be moved back into late October. This means that parents will have to submit their application before the result of any test is known.

Trafford has extended the limits of its application system this year to allow parents to submit preferences for up to 8 schools and guidance has been circulated to all Trafford parents on how to proceed.

We have been asked to remind all parents that they should submit their applications without delay and not wait for the outcomes of the selection tests.

Covid Regulations

Please can we remind you of the regulations regarding isolating due to exposure to COVID.
