Moorlands Junior School Sports Premium Funding 2016 – 2017 Report

For the academic Year 2016 – 2017 the Sport Premium Funding for Moorlands Junior School received was £9,180

The Sport Premium Funding was spent with the following aims at Moorlands:

- Increasing participation in activities such as games, dance, gymnastics, swimming and athletics
- Increasing participation and success in intra and inter competitive school sports
- Making the physical education curriculum more inclusive for all children and staff
- Expanding the growth in the range of traditional and alternative sporting activities
- Improving partnership work on physical education with other schools and other local partners
- Finding and exploring cross curricular links that contribute to pupils' overall achievement and their greater social, spiritual, moral and cultural skills
- Making pupils more aware of the dangers of obesity, smoking and other such activities that undermine pupils' health

Our Initial Plans to spend the Sport Premium Budget 2016-2017 included:

- Investment in the professional development of staff at our school, so they are best equipped to teach high quality engaging Physical Education. Leading to competitive intra and inter school sport, for years to come. This will include providing cover to release staff for professional development in PE and sport
- Continuous membership of the Trafford Schools Sports Partnership, at Ashton on Mersey School.
- To support and engage the least active children through new or additional sports clubs during the school day (breakfast, lunchtime clubs).
- Increasing the amount of competitive sport in which our children participate running sport competitions, and increasing pupils' participation in the School Games and inter school competitions
- Continuing to take part in local sports competitions/events organised by the SSP and local schools, during the year 2016/2017
- Purchase new PE resources enabling all students to do wet weather games in the event of the hall being unavailable.
- Setting up and running a 'Change for Life Club'.
- · Employing qualified sports coaches to work alongside staff for short PE modules in Cricket, Lacrosse, Hockey, Gymnastics and Dance.

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- \cdot Creating links with other community sports providers; encouraging pupils to join out of school sports clubs.
- · Encouraging and promoting our children to improve their leadership skills through sport; through a sports leader initiative.
- · Developing intra and inter school competitions.
- \cdot Developing the outdoor and adventurous activities element of the PE curriculum, utilising the school's own grounds and facilities.
- · Purchasing equipment offering access to new sports and physical activities before, during and after school

Impact and Sustainability:

Over the academic Year 2016 – 2017 we have used the Sport Premium to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport, so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach performance levels of which they are capable.

In PE we have looked at the progress of pupils and can see that all children are making improvements during sessions in all disciplines. Other areas of development such as self-esteem, confidence and the numbers of pupils involved in sporting activities in and out of school have had a significant improvement over the course of the academic year.

We have provided many links with external agencies which allow children a gateway into sport outside of school.

Staff have benefited from additional professional development opportunities in Yoga, Dance, gymnastics, cricket and hockey through CPD/ team teaching with a yoga teacher, dance specialist and sports coach. This has provided them with the skills to continue to build on their new knowledge.

At the end of the academic year we have been able to evidence the impact of our Sports Premium Funding on pupil progress and involvement in Sport through the achievement of the Sainsbury's Silver Award.
