during drop off and pick up times.

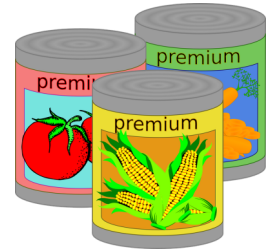
Harvest
